Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening at Participating Medical Institutions

(Original “Koho Moriya”, p. 11)

No matter what health insurance you have, you can get screened at participating institutions using a screening voucher.

If you already used a voucher in fiscal years 2024 and 2025, a new voucher for 2026 will be sent to you automatically between April and June (however, if you were advised to undergo further testing based on the result, you need to submit an application).

How to Apply

There are two ways to apply for a voucher:

- ① Visit the Moriya Health Center (守谷市 保健センター) to apply in person (applications via phone not possible).

Opening hours: Mon-Fri 8:30~17:15

- ② Apply online by visiting the [Ibaraki e-Application site](#) (Japanese only).

Applications are possible until March 15, 2027.

Vouchers are valid until March 31, 2027.

The voucher arrives approximately one week after applying. After you receive the voucher, make an appointment with your institution. After the examination, you will only have to pay the reduced amount.

Mother-Child Immunization Vaccination Against RSV

(Original “Koho Moriya”, p. 14)

This vaccine was previously offered on a voluntary basis. Starting in April, it will become part of the routine immunization schedule following amendments to the Immunization Law.

What is the Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)?

RSV is a virus that causes respiratory symptoms. It is estimated that most infants and young children are infected by the age of 2. When pregnant women receive the RSV vaccine (maternal-fetal vaccine), it can help prevent their newborns from developing severe RSV illness.

Eligibility

- pregnant women between 28 and 36 weeks 6 days at the time of vaccination
- * This includes women who received the RSV vaccine (maternal-fetal immunization vaccine) during a previous pregnancy.

Cost

- generally free
- * Vaccination will be administered at the gynecology clinic where you are currently receiving care or at the hospital where you plan to give birth.

Pre-vaccination Health Questionnaire

- distributed with Mother and Child Health Handbook (*boshi kenkō techō*)
- * Required at the time of vaccination. Those who have already received their handbook as of March 31, 2026, will receive a separate copy.

About the Vaccine

This vaccine is administered as a maternal-fetal immunization. Antibodies produced by the mother pass on to the fetus, providing protection against RSV from birth.

- **Name (Manufacturer):** Abrysvo (Pfizer)
- **Type:** recombinant vaccine
- **Number of doses:** 1
- **Administration method:** intramuscular injection
